Why a Getting Started League?

- * Full-year curling program for adults to learn how to curl
- * It looks like a regular league.....except......
 - * Proven curriculum
 - * More than 2 hours in the cold
 - * Proper tools
- * Goal → Create Curlers & Lifelong Members

How do we get started?

- Designate a Program Co-ordinator– someone in charge! Pay Them!
- * Allocate weekly ice time
- * Select a program
 - * 8 week
 - * Half year
 - * Full year (highly recommended)



Instructors

- * Recruit instructors. How many?
- * Who do you recruit?
 - * Enthusiastic
 - * Friendly
 - * Good communicators
 - * Young and Young At Heart
 - No competitive experience necessary



Where to find instructors

- Existing instructors
- * Retired people
- * Experienced curlers (not in years!!!)
- University or high schools students
- * Former competitive junior curlers
- Provincial / Territorial associations may have a list of certified instructors

How to recruit instructors

- * Reach out phone, email, bulletin boards
- * Advertise on your website, Facebook
- * Other media
- * Pay your instructors for their time

What to teach?

- * Detailed Curriculum is a "program in a box" everything you need to start the program.
- * LINK
- * 8 week program with weekly lesson plans:
 - Delivery in 3 easy lessons
 - * Sweeping
 - * Strategy
 - * Positions
 - * Games
 - * More.....

Show me the money

- Program costs: \$4,300 (4 sheet rink)
 - * Instructors: \$3,000
 - * (5 instructors per week x \$30 per person = \$150 night x 20 weeks)
 - * Equipment: \$800 (grippers and sliders)
 - * Miscellaneous: \$500 (prizes, dinner etc.)
- * Program revenue: \$8,000
 - * League fees: 32 x \$250
- * NET TO THE CLUB in \$\$\$
 - * \$8,000 \$4,300 = **\$3,700**
- * Net To The Club = PRICELESS!!!



Show me the money

Don't it ⊗

<u>Total</u>		= \$15,000
Year Four	– 4 x \$250	= \$1,000
Year Three	– 8 x \$250	= \$2,000
Year Two	– 16 x \$250	= \$4,000
Year One	– 32 x \$250	= \$8,000

Do it

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Year One -32 \times \$250 (less $4300) = $3,700

Year Two -24 \times \$250 = $7,500

Year Three -18 \times \$250 = $4,500

Year Four -16 \times \$250 = $4,000

Total =$19,700
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Benefits


- Extra \$4700 over four years
- More members means less recruiting
- More volunteers, bonspiel participants
- Budget growth (capital fund?)

Unintended Consequences

- * Bonspiel participants
- * U2 or U3 or U5
- * Volunteers / Board Members
- * Advocates

Equipment

- * Brooms, Full Slip-on Sliders & Grippers for both feet – supplied by club until???
- * Clean running shoes
- Warm, loose-fitting clothing (layered)
- * Mitts or Gloves
- Delivery Aids/Stabilizers supplied by club
- * Gather equipment information from the registration form i.e. shoe size



Communicate!

- * Frequently!
- * Email lesson plan to instructors weekly
- * Email all curlers prior to the season to tell them what to expect on the first night, what to bring etc.
- * Alert curlers to events at the club, volunteer opportunities etc.

Get ready for the first night

- * Trying a new thing is scary, intimidating, anxious
 - * Be welcoming, have name tags and greeters
- Explain EVERYTHING the first night
 - * 30 minutes off ice session to explain:
 - * How the league is going to work
 - * Introduce instructors
 - Introduce equipment
 - * Give tour of the club
 - * Answer questions
- * Smile remember "Enhanced Experience"
- * Everyone throwing stone(s) the first night is CRITICAL



Train the Trainers: Adding the Extras

Providing an Enhanced Experience



Enhanced Experience

- * How do we create an enhanced experience?
- * What can Getting Started Programs provide other than curling?

Bring out the props!

- * Stop watch nights
 - * Let beginners practice using stop watches, great lesson on weight control
- * Use pylons, cups to enhance lessons

Bring out the props!

- Prizes! (everyone loves free stuff!)
- Dust off the old trophies, have a "League winner"
- Keep individual scores during second half of league, award trophies to highest points (1 point for showing up, 2 points for a tie, 3 points for a win)

What else can we teach?

Curling isn't just about throwing a rock

- * What other "lessons" can we teach about curling?
- * What do you wish someone would have explained to you?

Extra Sessiona

- * Equipment demo
 - * Have an instructor or pro-shop owner explain different types of brooms, shoes etc.
 - * Do this before Christmas, when many beginners ask/get equipment!

Extra Sessions

* Ice maker demo

* Off-ice session where ice maker explains pebble, frost, how to make ice etc.

* Strategy demo

- * Off-ice demo with instructor who explains basic strategy (i.e. with hammer, throw to side of sheet, without hammer, throw to centre)
- * All demos should be done before/after regular session, so do not take away from ice time! Beginner curlers hate to lose ice time!

Extra Learning Opportunities

* Video analysis

* Use a smart phone, iPad etc.

* One-on-one lesson

* Curlers will pay extra for extra lessons on weekends, lunch hour etc.

* Lounge lessons

- * These often informal take place "after" curling while having a drink with instructors
- Strategy, team dynamics, explaining bonspiels etc.

Social Extras

* Christmas/half year party

* Let curlers organize this, if you do not have kitchen, order pizza, potluck etc.

* End of year party

Draw prizes, fun games etc.

* Membership isn't just about curling!

* Invite curlers to other club events, bonspiels etc. Beginners make great volunteers!

Make them Members!

* Pro-am

- * ½ day bonspiel, pair club curlers with new curlers for 4 end games (two experienced curlers playing backend, new curlers playing front end).
- * Great way to introduce new curlers to other members (and get them on teams!)

* Organize beginner bonspiel

- Half day/Full day beginner bonspiel
- Can be a point spiel, with lots of prizes, emphasis on fun
