

Curling Canada's Hit Draw Tappresented by CurlManitoba

Rules:

- 1. There are three age categories for the competition (6-7, 8-9 and 10-12).
- 2. There are three levels of competition-club, sport region, provincial.
- 3. No brushing is allowed during the competition.
- 4. Regulation curling stones are to be used by all categories (no little or light rocks allowed).
- 5. Full length sheet (unless otherwise indicated) is to be used.
- 6. Someone (parent, volunteer or other curler) can hold the broom for the thrower.
- 7. All participants must wear clean running shoes or curling shoes regardless of their curling experience.
- 8. All participant parents **must** sign the Registration form and Waiver prior to participating in the club level of the Hit, Draw or Tap competition. (the waiver will apply to all levels of the competition the child competes in)
- 9. Order of participation in the competition will be based on a random draw.
- 10. Each participant is allowed two practice shots (participant can choose whether they practice draws or hits) prior to their shots being scored.
- 11. Provincial finalists will be given access to the ice for a 10-minute open practice session/age category—no coaches or parents allowed.

Tie Breakers:

- 1. Ties will not be broken at the club level, any participant tied will advance to the Sport Region level.
- If a tie exists at the Sport Region level of the competition, each participant involved in the tie will compete in a playoff round to determine the final standings. The playoff round consists of the participants competing in another round of all three shots. The winner in each age category will advance to the provincial level.
- 3. At the Provincial Competition, ties will be broken by completing another round of the three shots for each of the participants.
