## **NEW CURLING CLUB ELIGIBILITY 2024-2025 in Manitoba**

- 1. A team must register the event with minimum 4 curlers.
- 2. All team members must be an affiliated member of their Provincial / Territorial Curling Association and registered member of the **same curling club**, paying a full league fee and playing regularly in a league. These qualifications may be verified by Provincial / Territorial Curling Association. It is the responsibility of the home club to provide an accurate verification if requested by Provincial / Territorial Curling Association. Clarity regarding definition of "league" can be received from each Provincial / Territorial Association
- 3. Players now **WILL NOT** be required to curl on the same team.
- 4. If you are not the 'one' player on the team without any restrictions, you and/or the other three players and any 5<sup>th</sup> players and any spares may have competed in any provincial / territorial championship in the previous three (3) seasons (2023-2024, 2022-2023, 2021-2022) and still allowed to play in the Curling Club Championships, as long as you don't match or surpass the thresholds set by your province (see chart below).

Yukon	You win a territorial championship
