

## **Curling Canada's Hit Draw Tap presented by CurlManitoba**

## **Rules:**

- 1. There are three age categories for the competition (6-7, 8-9 and 10-12).
- 2. There are three levels of competition-club, sport region, provincial.
- 3. No brushing is allowed during the competition.
- 4. Regulation curling stones are to be used by all categories (no little or light rocks allowed).
- 5. Full length sheet (unless otherwise indicated) is to be used.
- 6. Someone (parent, volunteer or other curler) can hold the broom for the thrower.
- 7. All participants must wear clean running shoes or curling shoes regardless of their curling experience.
- 8. All participant parents **must** sign the Registration form and Waiver prior to participating in the club level of the Hit, Draw or Tap competition. (the waiver will apply to all levels of the competition the child competes in)
- 9. Order of participation in the competition will be based on a random draw.
- 10. Each participant is allowed two practice shots (participant can choose whether they practice draws or hits) prior to their shots being scored.
- 11. Each participant will have three attempts per shot at the club level, and one attempt per shot at the regional and provincial competitions. The score is cumulative.

## Tie Breakers:

- 1. Ties will not be broken at the club level. The top three finishers including ties in each division at the club level will advance to the Sport Region level.
- 2. Ties at the regional and provincial level will be broken to determine 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> with a "sudden death" draw to the button draw is repeated until winner is determined. Officials will measure the distance from the pin to determine the winner. The winners in each age category in each Sport Region Competition will advance to the provincial level.
