Provincial Junior Men's Championship Format History:

From 1947 to 1953 the event was played with 8 teams playing a straight knockout. In 1954 the format changed to 8 teams broken into two groups of 4 playing a round robin with the winners of each group playing off to determine champion. In 1968 to 1973 16 teams competed, the teams were split it 4 groups of 4 with the winners of each group advancing to the semi-final and subsequent final. From 1974 to 2000, the teams played a semi-modified knockout event. In 2001, the round robin draw with the page playoff was introduced. During the period of 1947 to 1975 team members were required to be attending the same school. In 1976, that requirement was changed to the same school or curling club. In 2022, 12 teams competed. In 2023, an open format was used with 10 teams playing a round robin in two groups with a page playoff. In 2024, 9 teams played in a triple knockout draw followed by a page playoff. In 2025, 7 teams played a round robin with 3 teams qualifying for the playoff round.

Canadian Junior Men's Championship Format History

From 1947 – 1949 the championship was known as the Western Canadian Junior Men's In 1947, the event involved Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta. In 1948, British Columbia and Head of the Lakes was added. In 1950, the first national championship was played. In 1976, the last event known as the Canadian Schoolboys Championship was played. Beginning in 1977, the event became known as the Canadian Junior Men's Championship. The format has always been a round robin format, where each province or territory played one game against the other representatives. The playoff format has three teams reaching the championship round with the first place team receiving a bye to the final. In 2022, the top three teams in each pool qualify for the knockout playoff.

World Junior Men's Championship Format History

The first championship was played in 1975. Because the world age was 19 and Canada was 18, Canada elected to send their national champion the year after they won the championship. This continued until 1995, where in order to provide the opportunity for the 1994 winner to curl in a worlds, that team was inserted into the semi-final of the 1995 championship. The world format involved a complete round robin, with a semi final of 1vs 4 and 2vs 3, In 2008 the Page Playoff was introduced. In 2018, the format reverted to the semi final was 1vs4, 2 vs3. In 2022, the 2021 champion will represent Canada.

Provincial Final

Since 2001 the Page Playoff has been used to determine the champion. In the 23 years of this playoff system, the winner of the 1 vs 2 game has gone on to win on 7 occasions. On 9 occasions the loser of the 1 vs 2 game has come back to win. In 7 championships the 3 vs 4 winner claimed the championship. Teams skipped by Daley Peters (2004), Matt Dunstone (2016) and JT Ryan (2019) are the only teams to register unbeaten 9-0 records. In 2022 and 2023, Jordon McDonald was 7-0 and 6-0.
